**Sarah Savioli** was born in Sardinia in 1974. After graduating from Parma University with a degree in Natural Sciences, she obtained a master's degree in Forensic Sciences and another in Analytical Chemistry. She worked for more than ten years as a forensic technical-scientific expert, first in collaboration with the Physics Department of Parma University and the Carabinieri's RIS (Scientific Investigation Unit), then as a freelancer.

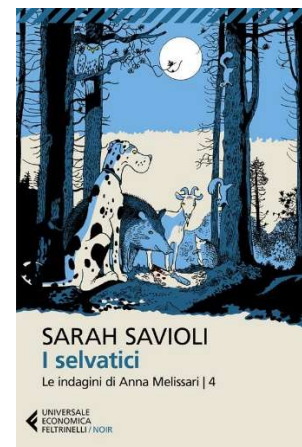
After leaving her job for personal reasons, she discovered writing and was twice a finalist in the “Romanzi in cerca d'autore” competition organised by Kobo and Mondadori.

He made his debut with Feltrinelli, publishing the first novel in the detective series featuring investigator Anna Melissari, *Gli insospettabili* (*The Unsuspectables*, 2020), followed by *Il testimone chiave* (*The Key Witness*, 2021, finalist for the Nebbia Gialla Prize), *La banda dei colpevoli* (*The guilty gang*, 2022), *I selvatici* (*The wild ones*, 2023) and, in September 2026 is forthcoming *The daisies version* (*La versione delle Margherite*), the fifth and last novel in the series.

For young readers, she has published *Tutto cambia!* (*Everything Changes!*) (2021, with illustrations by Kalina Muhova, finalist for the Strega Junior Prize) with Feltrinelli Kids, the children's crime novel *Delitto alla Tesla Academy* (*Murder at Tesla Academy*) (2023) and *Che botta!* (*What a Blow!*) (2024, with illustrations by Jessica Antonini).

Since 2023, she has been writing for La Repubblica's cultural supplement “Robinson”. In 2024 and 2025, she was President of the Jury for the Andersen Prize, Baia delle Favole in Sestri Levante. Since 2023, she has been on the jury for the Città di Sant'Anastasia Prize, a prize dedicated to short stories written by high school students.

He teaches literature classes for adults, but he is particularly dedicated to children and young people whom he meets in schools of all levels, where he holds courses and workshops aimed at promoting reading and exploring the world of stories as a way to learn more about ourselves and our surroundings.

Thanks to her unsuspected informants, Anna searches for a possible answer for the mother of Armando, a 34-year-old former drug addict who ‘fell’ from the building where he lived. The drug scene is the starting point for an investigation that—amid unexpected revelations, conversations with the most disparate creatures about the meaning of life, a four-year-old son with extremely imaginative questions, and a sister in perpetual emotional crisis—Anna sees become complicated in multiple directions. Like “many pieces of a puzzle, but all different from each other.”

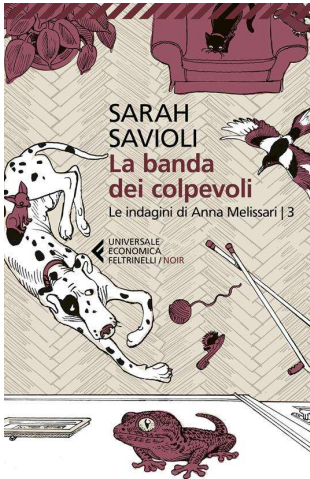

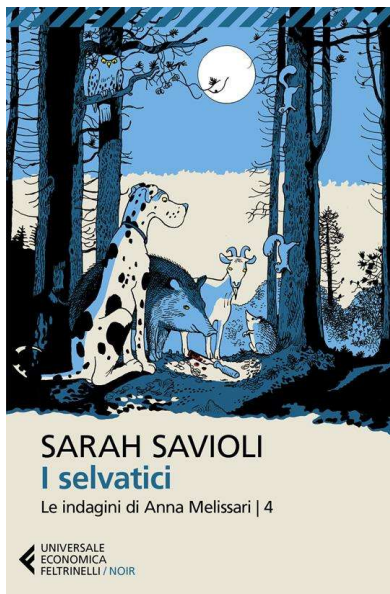

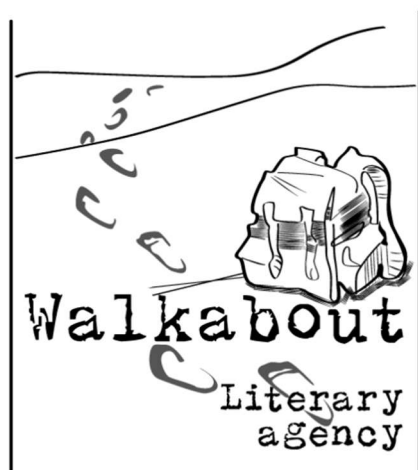

**Ombretta Borgia** is Owner and Rights and Contract Manager, she has been Portuguese translator and she has worked for 12 years as a Foreign Rights Manager for Editori Riuniti, before creating the agency.

“Walkabout” is a long ritual journey that Aboriginal people engage in, by walking through large expanses of grasslands in Australia; this allows them to have contacts and exchanges of resources, both material and spiritual, such as the traditional songs. Bruce Chatwin recounted the Walkabout in his “Songlines”: “(...) It was believed that each totemic ancestor, on his journey across the country had spread a trail of words and musical notes along his footprints, and that these Dream tracks had remained on the ground as a ‘way’ of communication between the various distant tribes. A song was simultaneously both a map and a transmitting aerial. (...) And a man during a *walkabout* always moved following a song path (...).”

We believe that the name Walkabout describes very well and encompasses the philosophy and the work spirit of our agency.
